PHILIP A. CAMPBELL (January 10)

Private services were held for Philip A. Campbell, 76, in Naples Florida with family members by his side. Mr. Campbell had a long and successful career with the telephone company. He began as a sales representative for New Jersey Bell in Trenton, in 1959, following graduation from Rutgers University. He later held a series of supervisory positions in the company's commercial plant departments. In 1979, he was promoted to President of AT&T's Indiana Bell Telephone, and subsequently to President of New Jersey Bell Telephone in 1982, before becoming President of Bell Atlantic Network Services and ultimately Vice-Chairman and CFO of Bell Atlantic until his retirement in 1991.

Mr. Campbell led Bell Atlantic through one of the most transformative eras in the telecom industry. Following the 1984 anti-trust decision by the US Department of Justice, AT&T's local operations were broken into 7 "baby bells" one of which was Bell Atlantic. From 1983 to January 1988, Mr. Campbell was the president of Bell Atlantic Network Services which managed all of the telephone operating companies in the Bell Atlantic region. His management style, enhanced by his master's degree in management from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1970, encompassed a unique understanding and empathy for the issues facing both management and labor. His extensive knowledge of the operating side of the business, his keen acumen for strategic thinking and his early leadership in embracing technology and international business awareness, made Mr. Campbell one of the key practitioners in the telecom industry of his generation.

He was a strong advocate of free markets and competition. In the early days of the AT&T divestiture many companies tried to inhibit the growth of the baby bells even though the Justice departments wanted to increase their scope of business activities for the benefit of consumers. Mr. Campbell was notably quoted as saying, "It's shameful and disingenuous for some of America's top companies to hide behind the façade of industry associations and try to hoodwink the public." He accused the groups of being, "unwilling to compete in an open marketplace."

Mr. Campbell was born in 1936 in Philadelphia, the son of the late Jeanette and Philip A. Campbell, Sr. His father was deceased when Phil was 8. He was raised in Collingswood and Gloucester City, graduating from Gloucester High School in 1954. He and his wife, Bernice were childhood sweethearts, recently celebrating 58 years of marriage.

Phil will be remembered by his family as an eternal optimist, a fair man of steadfast principle and integrity, who had an intense love of family and always put them first. He believed strongly in self-reliance, hard work, innovation, calculated risk-taking and personal sacrifice. His granddaughter described him as a man filled with wonder, courage, enthusiasm, determination, and kindness. You could find him performing magic tricks, playing the role of Santa, joking around with his buddies and family-foursomes on the golf course, cheering on the sidelines at this grandkids athletic events, and spending afternoon fishing in the back bays of his beloved Jersey shore. He lived life for each and every moment.

In addition to Bernice, he leaves behind a large extended family including sons Jeffrey and James, daughter Robin, seven grandchildren, five brothers and sisters and many nieces and nephews. He spend his retirement years enjoying his many pleasures of life-golfing, fishing, traveling and most importantly, spending time with his family.
